

What if it is True? (Grades 6-8)

The death and resurrection of our Savior Jesus Christ is the foundation of the Christian faith. Because of this, skeptics have tried many times (unsuccessfully) to disprove it. Some of them claim the resurrection never happened—it was just a story created by Jesus's disciples.

If someone asked you, "How do you know the resurrection really happened?" or "How do you know Jesus is God?" what would you tell them? It is our hope that this lesson will strengthen your faith and help you be ready to provide an answer to these questions.

How do we know it's true?

There is overwhelming evidence that the resurrection of Jesus Christ really happened! Since many people find it helpful to use acronyms to remember important information, we will be using the acronym P.E.T. Let's get started!

Prophecies

Prophecies are predictions about the future and the Bible contains hundreds of them! Although many prophecies have already come true, there are many that will not be fulfilled until Jesus Christ returns.

One of the ways we know Jesus is God is because He has already fulfilled hundreds of prophecies. Many of these prophecies were about the night Jesus was arrested and the events leading up to His crucifixion. Several prophecies predicted that Jesus would rise from the dead.

The table on the next page includes 34 specific prophecies that were fulfilled by Jesus. This is remarkable since these prophecies were all written at least 400 years before Jesus was born! What is the probability of just **eight** prophecies coming true in one person?

The probability of just 8 prophecies coming true in one person...

1 chance in 10²⁸ or 1 chance in 10,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000!

Eyewitnesses

In a court of law, people who saw something happen are called eyewitnesses. Testimonies by eyewitnesses are considered powerful evidence—especially when they agree on important details. The more eyewitnesses, the stronger the case.

Here is what the Apostle Paul said happened after Jesus rose from the dead:

...and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep." 1 Corinthians 15:4-6

Did you catch that? Paul said Jesus appeared to more than **500 people at the same time!** This was a bold claim that could have easily been verified. If you went to trial and could produce 500 witnesses who said they saw the same thing, I guarantee you would win your case!!

Transformation of the Disciples

One of the most overlooked lines of evidence for the resurrection is the transformation of the disciples.

When Jesus was arrested, His disciples ran away in terror. Afterwards, Peter followed Jesus from a distance and tried not to be noticed. When he was asked by a servant girl if he was a follower of Jesus, Peter denied that he **even knew Jesus** and he did this three times (just as Jesus had said he would)!

After Jesus was crucified, his disciples were scared. They hid themselves in a locked room—no doubt wondering if they were going to be killed as well. But something happened that transformed them from being frozen with fear to people who would not stop telling people about Jesus. What did they see? Jesus Christ rose from the grave and appeared to them!

For example, in the book of Acts, Peter and John were arrested by the religious leaders and told to stop talking about Jesus. Look at what they said in response:

"Then they called them in again and commanded them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. But Peter and John replied, "Judge for yourselves whether it is right in God's sight to obey you rather than God. For we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard." Acts 4:18-20.

Wow, talk about a change! Most of the disciples (except John who was exiled) gave up their lives for Jesus! Check this out:

- Peter crucified
- Andrew crucified
- James (son of Zebedee) killed with a sword
- John (son of Zebedee) exiled
- Philip crucified
- Bartholomew crucified
- Thomas killed by a spear thrust
- Mathew killed with a sword
- James (son of Alphaeus) crucified
- Thaddaeus killed by arrows
- Simon, the zealot -crucified
