

## What is the Bible? (Grades 6-8)

The Bible is an amazing, wonderful and powerful book that has been read by millions of people all over the world. However, when you first start to read the Bible, it may be very confusing. Why do some sections tell stories while others seem to be poetry? What is the difference between the Old Testament and the New Testament? 7. The second type of book in the Bible is P\_\_\_\_

These books often use creative imagery (word pictures) to express ideas. The book of P\_\_\_\_\_\_ includes a collection of songs that people used to (and some still do) sing about God.

8. The third type of book in the Bible is P\_\_\_\_\_

These books often contain warnings from God to Israel, Judah and other nations to stop sinning and predictions about the future. A lot of them

contain prophecies about Jesus. Some of these predictions have already come true while others will be fulfilled when Jesus Christ returns. Some examples of prophetic books include:

9. The fourth and final type of book in the Bible is L\_\_\_\_

These books were written by the Apostles to encourage Christians and answer questions about Jesus, God, and Christianity. The writers of these books were inspired by God (more on this later). These books are named after (1) the person the letter was written to, (2) the church the letter was written to, or (3) the person who wrote the letter. Some examples include:

10. Who wrote the Bible?


The Bible was written by \_\_\_\_\_ different people over \_\_\_\_\_ years on \_\_\_\_\_ continents yet only had one author. Can you guess who? If you said God, you're right! According to 2 Timothy 3:16, God told (inspired) the people who wrote the Bible what to say:

"All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness," 2 Timothy 3:16

That is why we call the Bible "God's Word". How do we know that the Bible is really God's Word? We will talk about that in our next lesson: "Can We Trust the Bible?"

Because the Bible is God's Word, we can trust it to answer questions about where we came from, our purpose in life, right / wrong and our eternal destination.

 Since the books of the Bible was originally written in Hebrew, Greek and Aramaic, they had to be translated into English. There are three major approaches to translations (1) word for word (2) thought for thought and (3) paraphrases. The chart below shows how popular translations fit on the spectrum.

  - 5. Remember that the Bible is really all about Jesus Christ


